An Anti-Deportation Campaign involves getting the support of friends, family and the wider community to make the government change their minds about your case and allow you to stay.

How to Campaign - Campaigning involves putting information about your case to the general public in order to get their support. By demonstrating to the Home Office that you have wide support, a campaign aims to influence their decision in your favour. Successful campaigning involves building support and solidarity at a local level and constructing a network of sympathetic contacts in your local community and throughout the country. Campaigning can include writing letters, collecting signatures for petitions, organising demonstrations, holding public events to attract media interest and also getting the support of your MP and other prominent figures.

You are not alone. - You will find other individuals and groups who are sympathetic and will be eager to help you in your efforts

Is a campaign necessary? - Because you cannot always rely on the law to keep you here, it is sometimes necessary to start a campaign against deportation or removal. It is your decision - and yours only - whether or not to set up a campaign. The campaign is about building and demonstrating support for your case so that the Home Secretary will use their wide discretionary powers to allow you to stay.

There cannot be a guarantee that a campaign will succeed, but there are many people who have won only because of a campaign.
